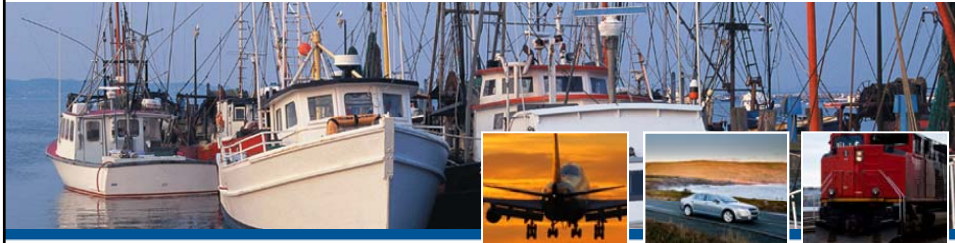


Hours of Work and Hours of Rest Regulations

Quebec Region Standing Committee on Fishing Vessel Safety,
Rimouski, February 14th 2013



Canada Shipping Act, 2001

- **The authorised representative develop procedures for the safe operation of the vessel**
- **The master shall take all reasonable steps to ensure the safety of the vessel and of persons**



Marine Personnel Regulations

Part 3 – Maritime Labour Standards Hours of Work and Hours of Rest

- **Applies to fishing vessels of 100 gross tonnage or more**



Marine Personnel Regulations

Part 3 – Maritime Labour Standards

The master shall ensure that every crew member and him have :

- **At least six consecutive hours of rest in every 24-hours period**
- **At least 16 hours of rest in every 48 hours period**



Marine Personnel Regulations

Part 3 – Maritime Labour Standards

The master:

- **Shall ensure that the danger posed by fatigue is taken into account**

- **Shall keep a record of hours of work and hours of rest**



Provincial Labour Standards

- **Weekly rest of at least 32 consecutive hours**

- **Right to refuse to work**
